

Introduction

Public libraries provide essential services to the residents of this state. Libraries provide programming and resources for Mississippians, helping them to meet their educational, informational, and entertainment needs. The 52 library systems in this state make resources available through 237 library buildings and two bookmobiles.

These statistics highlight key data about Mississippi public libraries. Including e-material, Mississippi libraries made 6,334,970 items available to the public in 2012. In addition, patrons were able to access 52 databases statewide. Libraries made 180 databases available to patrons on the local level.

In 2012:

MS libraries spent \$4.14 million on library materials to serve 1,449099 registered users.

Mississippians and visitors spent 2.25 billion at casinos.

Use of Mississippi Libraries


- Patrons of Mississippi libraries borrowed
 8.3 million items. Of those items, 2.3
 million were children's materials.
- Libraries requested 31,412 items from other libraries, making the most of their shared resources.
- 1.4 million of Mississippi's 2.99 million residents are registered library users.
- Patrons asked 1,531,890 reference questions.



Library Programs


In 2012, Mississippi libraries held 23,948 programs.

- 8,830 were geared towards adults or general audiences
- 1,839 were young adult programs
- 13,279 were children's programs

Summer Library Program



Each year, MLC supports public library involvement in the Collaborative Summer Library Program. Since 2010, the number of programs have increased by 22.2%, and the overall number of participants has increased by 12.98%. In that time, circulation of children's and YA materials during Summer Library Program decreased 4.1%.

Mississippians logged over 2.6 million sessions on their libraries' public internet computers.

- 351,685 patrons reported using library computers for job searches.
- 234,674 reported using library computers to file job applications.
- 129,743 used library computers to take online classes.



- Mississippi public libraries employed a total of 908 full-time equivalent staff in public libraries in 2012. FTE is based on a 40-hour week.
- Of these staff members, 127 have a Master's degree in Library Science (MLIS).
- Mississippi ranks 50th in the nation for the number of MLIS librarians per capita.
- Mississippi libraries spend \$24.3 million annually for staff salaries and an additional \$8.03 million for employee benefits. These figures amount to 67% of Mississippi library expenditures.

Income

Mississippi libraries reported \$50,334,006 in total revenue in 2012, or \$16.86 per capita.
