### Free Matter for the Blind and Physically Handicapped

- From the United States Postal Services web site:
- Q: Who is eligible to mail items free of postage due to a physical impairment?
- A: Persons who are blind or who cannot read or use conventionally printed matter due to a physical impairment...as follows:
- Certified participants in the Library of Congress National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped.
- Blind persons that fit one of the following criteria:
  - Visual acuity, as determined by competent authority, is 20/200 or less in the better eye with correcting lenses, or
  - Widest diameter of visual field subtends angular distance no greater than 20 degrees.
- Other persons with physical impairments certified by a competent authority as meeting one or more of the following conditions:
  - Having a visual disability, with correction and regardless of optical measurement, that prevents the reading of standard printed material.
  - Being unable to read or to use standard printed material because of physical limitations.
  - Having a reading disability resulting from organic dysfunction that is severe enough to prevent their reading printed material in a normal manner.
  - Meeting the requirements of eligibility resulting from a degenerative, variable disease that renders them unable to read or use conventional printed material because of impaired eyesight or other physical factors. These persons are eligible during the time in which they are certified by a competent authority as unable to read or use conventional materials.
- Persons must be:
  - Residents of the United States, including its territories, insular possessions, and the District of Columbia, or
  - American citizens domiciled abroad.
